

Amputee Bill of Rights

All individuals with limb loss and limb difference shall have, at a minimum, the following rights:

General Rights

- 1. The right to use or to not use a prosthesis and still be treated with respect and dignity and have an optimal quality of life.
- 2. The right to participate in employment, vocational training, and education including school-based extra-curricular activities without discrimination.
- 3. The right to have access to all businesses, facilities and activities with appropriate accommodations if necessary.
- 4. The right to conceive, parent and adopt children without prejudice due to limb loss/limb difference.
- 5. The right to freedom of movement in the United States utilizing all modes of public transportation.

Health Care Rights

- 1. The right to the highest-quality and affordable care, including the right to the most appropriate prosthesis and the best-qualified practitioners.
- 2. The right to timely and efficient treatment.
- 3. The right to play a meaningful role as an active member of a rehabilitation team that applies a coordinated team approach to health treatment across all disciplines, including prosthetics, physical therapy, and occupational therapy.
- 4. The right to mobility and/or activity free from physical problems resulting from an illfitting prosthesis.
- 5. The right to appropriate mental health and peer support.

Health Insurance Rights

- 1. The right to prostheses and other assistive devices as an essential health benefit covered by all payers.
- 2. The right to prostheses and other assistive devices free from any payer lifetime or annual limits.
- 3. The right to portable prosthetic care, free from any pre-existing condition exclusions.
- 4. The right to prompt authorization of treatment and clear disclosures of their financial responsibility.
- 5. The right to have the combined clinical judgment of their prosthetist and prescribing physician be the sole determinant of whether a particular prosthesis(es) or assistive device(s) is medically necessary.
